## GOVERNMENT HEALTH PLAN ELIGIBILITY REGULATIONS FOR PRENATAL, CHILDBIRTH AND POSTPARTUM SERVICES TO MEDICALLY INDIGENT PREGNANT WOMEN IN PUERTO RICO

Pursuant to the Act to Establish the Right to Prenatal, Delivery and Postpartum Care for Medically Indigent Pregnant Women in Puerto Rico, Act No. 105-2020, and Act No. 38-2017, as amended, known as the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act of the Government of Puerto Rico, the Secretary of Health intends to adopt the Government Health Plan Eligibility Regulations for Prenatal, Delivery and Postpartum Services for Medically Indigent Pregnant Women in Puerto Rico. The proposed regulation establishes that any pregnant woman who is medically indigent and who meets the eligibility requirements set forth in this regulation may receive prenatal, childbirth and postpartum health services, regardless of whether her immigration status is indefinite. With the adoption of this regulation, Regulation No. 8267 of October 16, 2012 is repealed.
